Food Allergy/Anaphylaxis Guidelines

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Gladewater ISD has developed an *Allergy/Anaphylaxis Action Plan* that has the components of the legal requirements included. Please contact your school nurse or visit our webpage before enrollment or at the start of the new school year to obtain all the required paperwork needed to help ensure the safety of your student with an allergy.

GISD Allergy Emergency Care Plans will be individualized to each student who has an allergy of any sort. Once notified of the student's allergy, per a signed physician's action plan, a working partnership with students, parents, physician, teacher, school nurse and administrators will be in place for the current school year.

If the allergy is related to food, Food Service Managers will be able to flag the child's account through the point-of-sale system as a reminder of the student's allergy.

While Gladewater ISD cannot guarantee an allergy-free environment at school, the district is committed to doing everything possible to ensure the safety of every child who has allergies.

Anaphylaxis

Anaphylaxis is a sudden, severe allergic reaction. The most dangerous symptoms include breathing difficulties, a drop in blood pressure or shock. Common examples of potentially life threatening allergies are those to foods or insect bites/stings. Other allergic reactions may also occur to medications, latex or while exercising. The emergency treatment is epinephrine, which is usually supplied in epi-pens.

Gladewater ISD has developed guidelines to manage students with these life threatening allergies, so that they may safely participate in the educational process. The medication must be authorized by a physician or healthcare provider. **Students may carry their epi-pens with them if found to be responsible for self administration by the physician, school nurse, and principal.** Physician note is required for self carry.

Please help us ensure the safety of our students at GISD.

Antihistamine Dose:

If symptoms do not improve, or symptoms return, more doses of epinephrine can be given about 5 minutes or more after the last dose.

Transport patient to ER, even if symptoms resolve. Patient should remain in ER for at least 4 hours because symptoms may return.


HOW TO USE AUVI-Q® (EPINEPHRINE INJECTION, USP), KALEO

- Remove Auvi-Q from the outer case. Pull off red safety guard.
- Place black end of Auvi-Q against the middle of the outer thigh.
- Press firmly until you hear a click and hiss sound, and hold in place for 2 seconds.
- Call 911 and get emergency medical help right away.



HOW TO USE EPIPEN®, EPIPEN JR® (EPINEPHRINE) AUTO-INJECTOR AND EPINEPHRINE INJECTION (AUTHORIZED GENERIC OF EPIPEN®), USP AUTO-INJECTOR, MYLAN AUTO-INJECTOR, MYLAN

- 1. Remove the EpiPen® or EpiPen Jr® Auto-Injector from the clear carrier tube.
- Grasp the auto-injector in your fist with the orange tip (needle end) pointing downward. With your other hand, remove the blue safety release by pulling straight up.
- Swing and push the auto-injector firmly into the middle of the outer thigh until it 'clicks'. Hold firmly in place for 3 seconds (count slowly 1, 2, 3).
- Remove and massage the injection area for 10 seconds. Call 911 and get emergency medical help right away.



HOW TO USE IMPAX EPINEPHRINE INJECTION (AUTHORIZED GENERIC OF ADRENACLICK®), USP AUTO-INJECTOR, AMNEAL PHARMACEUTICALS

- 1. Remove epinephrine auto-injector from its protective carrying case.
- 2. Pull off both blue end caps: you will now see a red tip. Grasp the auto-injector in your fist with the red tip pointing downward.
- Put the red tip against the middle of the outer thigh at a 90-degree angle, perpendicular to the thigh. Press down hard and hold firmly against the thigh for approximately 10 seconds.
- Remove and massage the area for 10 seconds. Call 911 and get emergency medical help right away.

HOW TO USE TEVA'S GENERIC EPIPEN® (EPINEPHRINE INJECTION, USP) AUTO-INJECTOR, TEVA PHARMACEUTICAL INDUSTRIES

- Quickly twist the yellow or green cap off of the auto-injector in the direction of the "twist arrow" to remove it.
- Grasp the auto-injector in your fist with the orange tip (needle end) pointing downward. With your other hand, pull off the blue safety release.
- Place the orange tip against the middle of the outer thigh at a right angle to the thigh. 3.
- Swing and push the auto-injector firmly into the middle of the outer thigh until it 'clicks'. Hold firmly in place for 3 seconds (count slowly 1, 2, 3).
- Remove and massage the injection area for 10 seconds. Call 911 and get emergency medical help right away.

HOW TO USE SYMJEPI™ (EPINEPHRINE INJECTION, USP)

- When ready to inject, pull off cap to expose needle. Do not put finger on top of the device.
- Hold SYMJEPI by finger grips only and slowly insert the needle into the thigh. SYMJEPI can be injected through clothing if necessary.
- After needle is in thigh, push the plunger all the way down until it clicks and hold for 2 seconds. 3.
- Remove the syringe and massage the injection area for 10 seconds. Call 911 and get emergency medical help right away.
- Once the injection has been administered, using one hand with fingers behind the needle slide safety guard over needle.

ADMINISTRATION AND SAFETY INFORMATION FOR ALL AUTO-INJECTORS:

- Do not put your thumb, fingers or hand over the tip of the auto-injector or inject into any body part other than mid-outer thigh. In case of accidental injection, go immediately to the nearest emergency room.
- If administering to a young child, hold their leg firmly in place before and during injection to prevent injuries.
- Epinephrine can be injected through clothing if needed.
- Call 911 immediately after injection.

OTHER DIRECTIONS/INFORMATION (may self-carry epinephrine, may self-administer epinephrine, etc.):

Treat the person before calling emergency contacts. The first signs of a reaction can be mild, but symptoms can worsen quickly.
