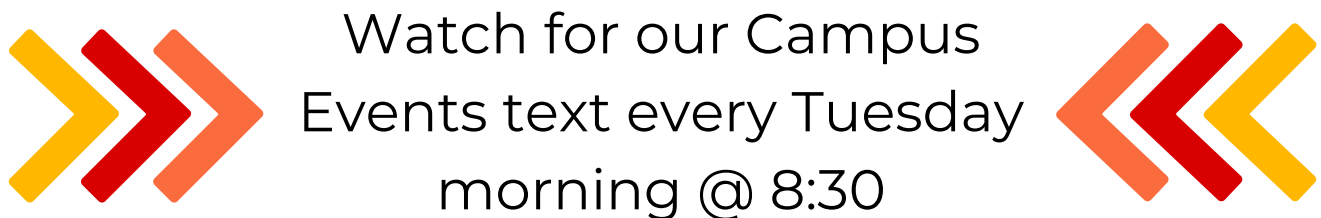
Budget Planning and Legislative Updates

WELDON ELEMENTARY



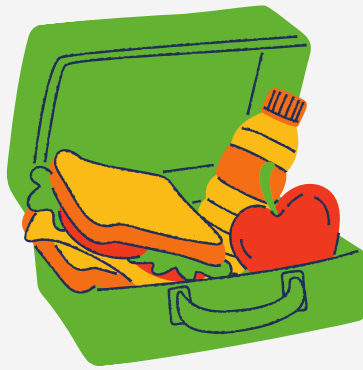

Some are builders, coders, problem solvers, communicators and a team captain who must be cool under pressure. The winning team utilized teamwork from each of these positions to be successful!

They built their robots and at a recent competition successfully coded and performed 7 tasks in 90 seconds, scoring 140 points in one run! The tasks are things like following a line using a color sensor, ringing a bell, loading chickens into the truck, spinning to simulate a tornado, crossing a broken bridge and pushing sand bags and blocks to prevent flooding.

Team harmony is important because they work together very closely and need to communicate clearly all the steps and processes. 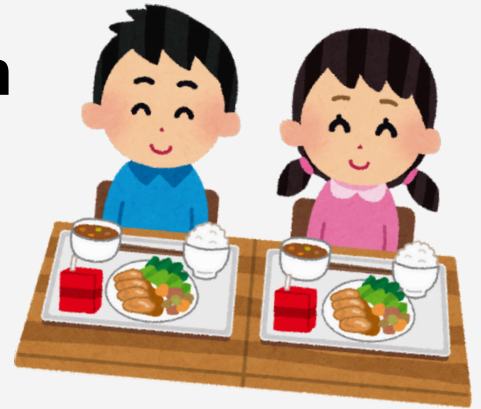

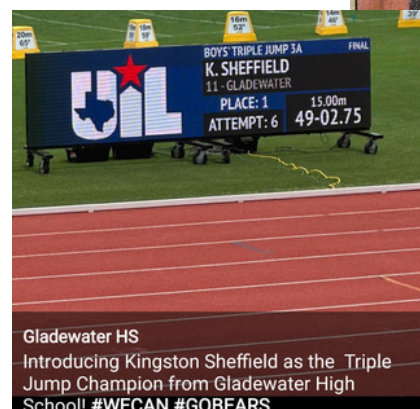

Transportation News

Parents/Guardians of Gladewater ISD Students:

I want to share my deepest gratitude for you and your students. Gladewater ISD Transportation Department has had an exceptional school year, and we have enjoyed the time spent transporting your students each day. With the school coming to an end, I wanted to take this opportunity to share a few changes that will be implemented for next school year, and remind you of current policies that will still be enforced.

1. The Transportation Department will be relocating to 729 Virginia Drive. This will be in the same parking lot that we have been in for years, just a different building.
2. Students will NOT be issued a new bus card for the 2025-2026 school year. I strongly encourage you to collect the cards from your students and put them in a safe place. The card that was used for this year will be the same card they use next year. In the event that a card is lost, broken, or misplaced, you will be responsible for paying the \$5 fee for a new card.
3. ALL students will need to be registered to ride the bus for the 2025-2026 school year. This will take place during back to school registration. There will be a “cut off” during registration. After the “cut off” date, students who have not registered for the bus will not receive transportation services for the first week of school. This will help minimize confusion at the campus, and allow for the transportation department to create and share accurate information for bus riders. We will provide the date closer to registration.
4. Students are only allowed 1 pick up location and 1 drop off location, at district approved locations (home, grandparents, or licensed daycares within Gladewater ISD boundaries). Students are not permitted to ride home with friends, or to their parent’s place of employment.

We hope you have a very happy and safe summer break! Enjoy time with your family and friends, and we’ll see you in August!
